**INSTRUCTIONS
FOR IMMERSION OF UTENSILS
(TEVILLAS KEILIM)**

There is an obligation to immerse in a mikvah all eating/drinking utensils received/purchased from a non-Jew.

If one has utensils that don't require a *Bracha*, it is preferable to immerse them at the same time as he/she is immersing those utensils that do require a *Bracha*.

This chart is only a guide. Halachic opinions vary regarding many of the items listed in the above table. Many utensils are made of several materials, some of which require tevillah & others that do not. Disassembly is usually not required. For these & other utensils not mentioned above, **please consult your rabbi to ascertain the requirements for tevillah.**
